


**BETTY BOOP SWEATER**

## BETTY BOOP SWEATER



**MATERIALS:** Allow the following quantities in 50 g balls of Sirdar Country Style 4-ply and 10 m skeins of Coats Tapisserie Wool: 4 Country Style 4-ply in main colour (white 412) for 61 cm and 66 cm sizes; 5 for 71 cm and 76 cm sizes; 6 for 81 cm size. For any one size: 1 ball of Country Style 4-ply in black (417); 2 skeins of Tapisserie Wool in flesh (3159), and 1 in gold (3000), red (013) and pale green (0566); a pair each of No. 10 (3¼ mm) and No. 12 (2½ mm) knitting needles.

**TENSION:** Work at a tension of 28 stitches and 36 rows, to measure 10×10 cm, using No. 10 (3¼ mm) needles, to obtain the measurements given.

**ABBREVIATIONS: To be read before working:** K., knit plain; p., purl; st., stitch; tog., together; k.2 tog.b., k.2 tog. through back of sts.; s.s., stocking st. (k. on the right side and p. on the wrong side); inc., increase (by working twice into next st.); dec., decrease (by working 2 sts. tog.); single rib is k.1 and p.1 alternately; nil, meaning nothing is worked here for this size; m., main colour; bk., black.

**NOTE:** The instructions are given for the 61 cm (24 inch) size. Where they vary, work figures within first brackets for the 66 cm (26 inch) size; work figures within second brackets for the 71 cm (28 inch) size, and so on.

**SPECIAL NOTE:** Tapisserie Wool is made up of 4 strands, but only 3 strands are used together for motif. Separate and remove 1 strand from each skein before working.

**THE BACK AND SLEEVES:** Work as given for Fireman Sam sweater.

**THE FRONT:** Work as given for Fireman Sam sweater to ★★.

Change to No. 10 (3¼ mm) needles and, beginning with a k. row, s.s. 8 (12) (16) (22) (30) rows.

Continue in s.s. joining in colours as required (see Special Note), using a separate ball of m. each side of motif and twisting yarns when changing colours to avoid a hole.

Place motif as follows:

**1st row:** 53 (56) (60) (63) (67) m., 2 bk., 37 (40) (44) (47) (51) m.

**2nd row:** 37 (40) (44) (47) (51) m., 3 bk., 52 (55) (59) (62) (66) m.

Keeping continuity of chart as set, and reading odd-numbered rows from right to left and even-numbered rows from left to right, s.s. a further 63 (63) (63) (67) (67) rows.

Work as Fireman Sam sweater from ★★★ to end.

**THE NECKBAND:** Work as given for Fireman Sam sweater.

**TO MAKE UP THE SWEATER:** Press and make up as given for Fireman Sam sweater. Using bk., embroider inner edges of earrings with small straight sts.
